### Orientation Programme for the First Year Students

A 6 day long “Orientation and Induction Programme” was organized for the first year students starting from 6<sup>th</sup> August 2022.



On the first day (6<sup>th</sup> August 2022) the first year students were given a warm welcome by the faculty and students of School of Vocational Studies. Dr. Daxesh Thakar-Provost of VVWU addressed the students and motivated them to make the most of their important years of life that they will spend in college.

On 8<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> August, 2022 skill development workshop in collaboration with Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) was organised. **Lippen Jewellery**

On 4<sup>th</sup> July 2022, a workshop on 'Lippen Jewellery' for TY.B.Sc and TY.B.Voc students was organised. Ms.Mina Jagani, was invited as the resource person and she described the procedure and techniques of new approaches that are being utilized.

This art style is generally produced using white paint. She described how color might be included in the art form. Mirror cut-outs improved the design even further. The workshop was well-received, and students produced a wide variety of artwork.
